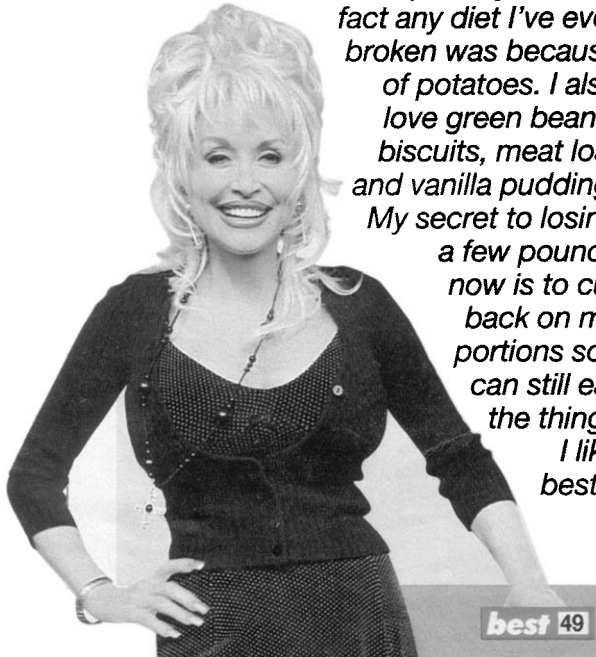

Breakthrough on pub glasses

ONE of the nastiest weapons used in bar room brawls could be consigned to the scrap heap by an innovation from an East Yorkshire firm.

Leerco Engineering, of Full Sutton Industrial Estate, near Stamford Bridge, has produced a new glass, which if broken, smashes into tiny bits – similar to modern car windscreens – making it virtually impossible to use them as a weapon.

Leerco sales director Steven Blazye said: “If you take one of these things and smash it on the side of a bar it literally just crumbles and you are not left with anything.

“If you take a normal pub glass and break it you are left with long shards attached to the base.”

The technique being pioneered by Leerco was not previously possible.

How can I improve my memory?



DOMINIC O'BRIEN, 40, is an author and five times winner of the World Memory Championships:

"I WAS determined to improve my memory when I saw a man on Record Breakers memorising a shuffled deck of cards in 2 mins 59 secs. In 1991 I beat his record with 38.29 secs.

"The best way to improve your memory is by word association. Link things – key to door, confetti to wedding.

"Remember, it's never too late to start improving your memory. It doesn't matter what age you are. Many experts may disagree but I believe the older you become the more agile your brain is."



ANDREW MAYES, 52, of Sheffield University, is an expert on memory disorders:

"THE best way to improve your memory is to improve the way you process information. The rule is to relate it to things you know a lot about so it all sinks in in a meaningful fashion.

"Grandmaster chess players remember chess positions better than everyone else because they know more about the subject – the same with football fans and scores.

"But it's possible for someone just to have a bad memory. It could be something to do with the brain or the way you are processing the information."



CLARE HARVEY, 44, of the International Flower Repertoire, is an authority on the use of essences:

"FLOWER essences play a vital role in improving your memory and have been used for thousands of years by the Australian aborigines.

"All these essences help to get the brain into gear and are good for strengthening and re-balancing the memory. There are many, many more – so many in fact that I'm co-author of an encyclopaedia of essences which can affect memory."



DAVID THOMAS, 47, from Elland, West Yorks, was recently crowned Britain's Memory Man:

"THE skill to having a good memory boils down to training. The two most important things are technique and imagination.

"Everyone can have a good memory – there's no limit to what you can learn. I had a pretty average memory but dedication changed that. The brain has infinite power. You'd be surprised at the riches within it. I hope I have enough to win the world title!"

Many people skip exercise because they don't know what type of activities best suits their personality, says Peg Jordan, editor of *American Fitness* magazine. Some people may be a combination of two or more exercise personality types. In her new book, *The Fitness Instinct*, Jordan outlines these types of exercisers.



RACER

The CEO in society. Competitive, aggressive, bored easily, loves to develop skills and strategy. Will train for a marathon, tennis match, long-distance bike ride. May like martial arts classes, racquet sports, race-walking clubs.

STROLLER

Social, friendly, supportive, relaxed. Works best if there's a buddy to exercise with. Nicknamed "walkie talkie" because he or she likes to chat with a friend while walking. Needs a social network to get involved in exercise. Other good choices: aerobics class, ballroom dancing, bellydancing.



DANCER

Lively, enthusiastic, energetic, extroverted, loves variety in exercise. Doesn't do well with goal-oriented activities. May buy a piece of exercise equipment, but is unlikely to use it every day. Needs to do something different daily. May do in-line skating one day, swim the next, take a yoga class the following day.

TREKKER

Disciplined, highly organized, very efficient, reliable. Enjoys working out alone. Can buy the treadmill and park it in front of the TV and get on it every day. Is very likely to be getting enough exercise to impact health. May benefit from some cross-training exercises to work different muscle groups.
